

DEQ SEEKS NOMINATIONS FOR 2006 GULF GUARDIAN AWARDS

Deadline extended to Sept. 15

The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality is seeking recipients for the Gulf Guardian Award. As a partner with the Gulf of Mexico Program, DEQ is encouraging Louisiana residents to nominate citizens, companies and organizations that are taking positive steps to keep the Gulf of Mexico and associated coastal water habitats healthy, beautiful and productive.

The Gulf of Mexico Program created the Gulf Guardian Award in 2000. The award was developed as a way to honor individuals and groups who are striving to make an environmental difference in the Gulf of Mexico. Each year, first, second and third place awards are given in six categories which include business, government, civic/nonprofit, youth/education, partnerships, and individuals.

“Many people in Louisiana work hard to protect and improve the state’s coastal environment around the Gulf. This area is important to the environmental preservation of the state and also the nation,” said Karen Gautreaux, DEQ Deputy Secretary. “These stewardship efforts are worthy of the recognition the Gulf Guardian Award brings. We want to encourage everyone to submit nominations.”

The Gulf of Mexico Program was started in 1988 and consist local, state and federal government agencies, the business and agricultural community, fishing industry, university scientists and environmental and community leaders from five Gulf Coast states. The goal is to protect, restore and maintain the health and productivity of the Gulf of Mexico ecosystem in a way that is cooperative, non-regulatory and economically sustainable.
